5 Weekly Words:- Ambling, rectify, scandal, modify, reject

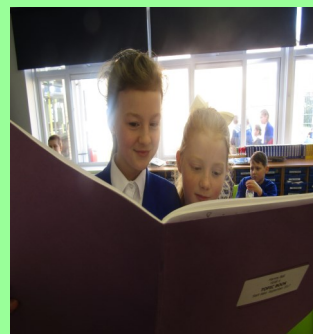
Year 5
